D. Newlin Fell Elementary School GOALS

- At least 70% of Kindergarten students and 50% of 1st and 2nd grade students will score at target by the Spring AIMSweb+ assessment.
- No more than 25% of 3rd grade students and 20% of 4th 8th grade students will score below basic on the 3rd grade PSSA-ELA assessment.
- At least 63% of students in grades 3-8 will score at the advanced/proficient performance levels.
- No more than 20% of students in grades 3-8 will score below basic on the Math PSSA.
- At least 50% of students in grades 3-8 will score at the advanced/proficient performance levels.
- At least 50% of students will attend 95% of days or more.
